How have you found the first 6 months?

My first 6 months in post have been very quick! I started just before the start of the Easter programme quickly followed by the Summer programme. It has been a great opportunity to establish a daily presence of a Street Level member of staff in the centre and to build relationships with colleagues and regular young people who attend. I have also been able to formalise some of the Street Level policies and procedures which will be an ongoing process as well as establishing volunteer training in partnership with Carluke

Where is the focus of your time at the moment?

On a weekly basis most of my time is taken with Face-to-Face work and prep for these sessions. Over the October week programme Street Level with Universal Connections were able to offer an outing each day for different groups. Street Level was able to fund outings to ice-skating, Rollerstop and the Skypark at Braehead. In addition, there were 9 sessions available at Street Level so in total there were 129 engagements with young people and families.

I have been involved with Carluke Young Carers group for many years as a Street Level sessional staff member and I am happy to be continuing with this group. They are an amazing group of young people who show great resilience in their everyday

lives. Everyone in the group has a caring responsibility in their home for a parent or sibling so the group gives them a safe space each week to come and have fun. They can spend time with others living in a similar situation, so coming along to group can give them a sense of belonging with their peers. The Group also gives them the opportunity to try new things that may not be possible to do with their family. For those who have been in the group for a few years, it's amazing to see their journey from where they started to where they are now and it's an absolute privilege to be part of that.

The P7/S1 transition night has always been well attended however over the Summer numbers in this age group dipped. Thankfully with some promotion in primary schools after the Summer break these numbers have increased again. There are some young people who attend faithfully every week and thoroughly enjoy their time at the centre with new friends they have made. This is the new generation of Street Level and it's great to hear the young people talk about older relatives and even parents that used to attend Street Level. It certainly keeps us on our toes to find new and innovative ways to keep the activities exiting and engaging.

In addition to this I have had the opportunity to network within the local community groups and with the churches involved in funding Street Level. It's great to make these connections and moving forward with ways we can complement each other's work to best meet the needs in the local community especially for young people. These connections are something I hope to continue to strengthen over time and with further involvement.



How might things develop moving forward?

Funding is one of my main priorities and although we are not quite in the New Year the Summer break will be here before we know it. Not only do we require funding to be able to offer trips and activities over school holidays, but we also require additional funding for resources for the weekly groups for young people.

It's great to have lots of regular young people at Street Level but I think it'd even better if there was more variation in the young people that do attend.

Realistically I know not everyone will want to come along to Street Level, but I would love in the future if there was a slot on the weekly calendar, that those who want to would have a time they were able and willing to come along.
